## Competition Conditions

1. Entries are restricted to amateurs who are a member of a golf club, holding a Golflink number with Golf Australia.
2. The committee shall have the right to refuse the entry of any person without being required to give any reason for such refusal.
3. The competition shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as adopted by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews, Scotland, together with local rules in force on the course when the competition takes place.
4. If a dispute arises at any point, it shall be decided by the committee in charge of the competition, whose decision shall be final.
5. The committee has the power to temporarily alter a player's handicap in accordance with the handicapping system.
6. Players must be prepared to play when called upon by the committee.
7. In every event, players will be drawn against each other for the day in such a manner as the committee may arrange.
8. In the event of a tie, the result will be determined by using the countback system as laid down by Golf Australia.
9. The committee may, in the event of extreme weather, or for any other reason, either cancel or shorten any contest, or fix another day.
10. Maximum handicap of 36 applies to men's events and 45 for women's events.
11. No player is eligible to win more than one major trophy on one day, teams events not including.
12. The committee may limit the number of entries which are received for any event and alter the start time of any event.
